ANWCC CHAMPIONSHIP EVENT GUIDELINES

ANWCC does not impose any technical regulations beyond those in the Motorsport UK Year Book. Below are guidelines to assist the organisers and the Championship officials.

1. Register the event with the ANWCC Championship Co-Ordinator. Forms are available on the website – see under “For Club Officials” – or from the Championship Co-Ordinator, requesting details of the event title, date, type, status, location and club contact, and indicate request for championship status. Organisers must advise if there are any restrictions on entries other than those imposed under Motorsport UK regulations (e.g. 2WD cars only on stage rallies). Restrictions may prevent an event from being included in the ANWCC Championships.
2. **Due to changes made by Motorsport UK for 2020, with regards to event status and competition licences we have changed things a little for our Championship events that qualify for the Autotest, Production Car Autotest, Autosolo and Car Trials Championships, as follows:**
3. **All ANWCC Championship Rallies (Stage, Forest, Road & Navigation, Historic Road and Targa Road) must be run at Interclub status – this is no different to our 2019 regulations. Competitors will require a minimum of RS Interclub Competition Licence (formerly the National B licence), drivers on Stage Rallies will require the RS Interclub Stage (formerly the Stage National B licence). Higher grade licences (National, formerly National A, and International will also be valid.**
4. **All ANWCC Championship Autotest, Production Car Autotest, Autosolo and Car Trials must be run at Clubman status – this is a change from 2019 where only some of the ANWCC Championship events were run at Clubman status (Motorsport UK regulation D4.5.4 applied). Competitors will require a minimum of RS Clubman Competition Licence – which is FREE. This replaces the Clubman licence. Higher grade licences (RS Interclub, RS National and International will also be valid). Note that competitors may apply for the RS Clubman licence at event signing-on although it is suggested that they complete the application online in plenty of time before the event. Note also that passengers, in events where permitted, must also be in possession of a RS Clubman licence minimum. Competitors under 18 years of age must provide a Parental Consent form before competing.**
5. **Organisers of Clubman events that qualify for the ANWCC Championships listed in Section 4 above must state that the event is “open to all registered contenders in the appropriate ANWCC Championship”.**
6. **All ANWCC Championship Sprints and Hillclimbs must be run at Interclub status, formerly National B. This is unchanged from 2019. Competitors licence requirements are unchanged, other than National B becomes Interclub.**
7. Note that all Clubman status events, regardless of championship status, must be included for inclusion on the ANWCC Calendar (Motorsport UK regulations D3.1.1).
8. Listing of events will be published by the ANWCC on the website – see “Calendar” link on the website home page.
9. Copies of the Motorsport UK permits can be downloaded from our website – see “Motorsport UK Permits 2020” on website home page. If necessary contact the Championship Co-Ordinator for details of the ANWCC Championship title and Motorsport UK Permit numbers that are to be included in event regulations.

10. Contact the ANWCC Championship Co-Ordinator for details of advertisements for inclusion in event websites and regulations. The ANWCC advert is on the home page under “For Club Officials”, place cursor on it, right-click and save to your computer, or request jpg version from Championship Co-Ordinator. Note the correct advert is the one with the website www.anwcc.co.uk

11. Organisers are requested to allow ANWCC supporting traders to attend events to provide a service for championship contenders.
12. Announce in event regulations that the event is a qualifying round of the appropriate ANWCC Championship(s).
13. Ensure that eligibility for competing on the event includes ANWCC Championship contenders - either by inviting the Association as a whole, or by inviting registered ANWCC Championship contenders. ANWCC's acceptance to championship qualifying events will be automatic.
14. Include space on the entry form for competitors to indicate whether or not they are registered for the ANWCC Championships.
15. Details of registered ANWCC Championship contenders can be supplied on request so that they can be advised that regulations are available and entries are open. This can be supplied in Excel or Word format – this will include names, addresses, telephone numbers and e-mail addresses. Alternatively, we can send self-adhesive addressed labels – ready for putting on envelopes, along with a printed list – this can be a complete set, or only those competitors who have advised us that they do not have web access. Note this is subject to GDPR restrictions – refer to the Privacy policy on the website.
16. If regulations are available on your club website please advise us of the link and we shall publish this on ours. It is preferable that we link to your website rather than load full regulations onto ours. It also ensures that the information is up-to-date should you change anything!
17. The onus of obtaining regulations and submitting entries rests entirely with the competitors.
18. On published entry lists indicate which competitors are ANWCC Championship contenders. A full list can be obtained from the ANWCC Championship Co-Ordinator if required. If your event classes differ from ANWCC Championship classes please ensure that the published information is sufficient for adjustments to be made for our scoring, e.g. if engine classes based on engine sizes differ between event and championship, show engine cc on entry list.
19. Send copy of the entry list and final instructions to the ANWCC Championship Co-Ordinator, if possible by e-mail or advising of a link to the organiser's website.
20. Updated championship charts may be sent for display at event signing-on. These will also be available in pdf format from the website as soon as practical after each qualifying event.
21. Event signing-on teams may be supplied with Championship registration forms for any competitor to sign up if they wish, they are also available on the website. Signing-on teams are requested to accept completed forms and relevant fees. Forms and fees to be returned to the Championship Co-Ordinator as soon as practical after the event. It should be noted that our registration fee gives competitors the right to score points in all our championships, also note that competitors may wish to donate to the ANWCC Marshals Fund – please record payment made on the bottom of the form.
22. Organisers to send final starters list and results to the ANWCC Championship Co-Ordinator as soon as possible after the event. If using a recognised computerised results system (e.g. Tynemouth; rallies.info; Rallyroots – others are available) then the results may be picked up by the Championship Co-Ordinator.
23. Organisers to return any completed ANWCC Championship registration forms as soon as possible after the event. Competitor's forms received up to seven days after an event can have points back-dated.
24. ANWCC Championship Co-Ordinator will update Championship tables for publication on the website.
25. Organisers must inform the ANWCC Championship Co-Ordinator of any changes to the event date. Championship status will be retained if no valid objections are received from competitors.
26. An ANWCC Championship Registration fee is payable by the organising club for ANWCC Championship Rallies – this will be invoiced to the organising Club Treasurer, usually at the end of the month of the event, and should be paid by the date of the next ANWCC meeting (usually second week of February, May, August and November). This is based on £1 per ANWCC Championship contender that starts, up to a maximum of £30.
