ANWCC CHAMPIONSHIPS 2026

These apply from 1st January 2026 and supersede previous ANWCC Championship regulations.

Changes are indicated by a vertical red line at left of paragraph.

Motorsport UK regulation numbers quoted are the 2026 National Competition Regulation (NCR) numbers.

[1] GENERAL REGULATIONS

[1.1] The Championships are organized and administered by the Association of North-Western Car Clubs (hereinafter referred to as the ANWCC) in accordance with the National Competition Regulations (NCR) of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these championship regulations.

[1.2] The Championships have been registered with Motorsport UK, and will operate under Championship Permits, as detailed below:

[1.3] The Championships are open to all members of the member clubs of the ANWCC and competitors must register by completing the ANWCC Championship Registration Form and submitting it, together with the registration fee, to the ANWCC Championship Secretary. A registration fee of £18 will entitle a competitor to score points on all ANWCC Championship events.

Competitors aged under 17 at the time of registration will receive free registration.

By registering for the Championship all competitors and their associates commit to positively promote and demonstrate the Motorsport UK's Respect Code which is appended to these regulations.

Where any reports of disrespectful conduct are judged to be well-founded the

Championship organisers may issue warnings or require remedial actions and/or report the matter to the Championship Stewards who may impose appropriate penalties which can include loss of Championship points and/or race bans through to Championship Expulsion and referral to Motorsport UK.

It is imperative that we promote the safety and wellbeing of young people and adults at risk. In addition to this all participants must be aware of their behaviour and conduct at all times and abusive language and harmful behaviour will not be tolerated. Any such incidents must be reported to the Championship Co-ordinator and/or Safeguarding Officer who will also relay the report to Motorsport UK. Details of the Motorsport UK Policies and Guidelines are available at www.motorsportuk.org/resource-centre by selecting Policies and Guidelines.

[1.4] No points will be awarded for events tackled more than 7 days prior to registration.

[1.5] A registration card, bearing the ANWCC Championship Registration Number, will be issued to each registered championship contender by e-mail for renewals, post with decals for newcomers.

[1.6] The qualifying events will be a series of Interclub status events, or Clubman status for events that comply with Motorsport UK NCR 3.7.2.4, organised by member clubs of the ANWCC. The provisional list of qualifying events is included with these regulations, the list is correct at time of going to press. If a change of date is enforced by instances outside the control of ANWCC then championship status may be retained at the discretion of the Championship Co-Ordinator, along with the Championship Stewards, whose decision is final. Changes will be published on www.anwcc.co.uk, social media (Facebook and ANWCC Chatter) published by the Association.

[1.7] Events scheduled or postponed until after 7th December 2026 will be removed from the 2026 Championships, but may be considered for inclusion in the following years' championship.

[1.8] It is the competitors' responsibility to obtain regulations for the individual events they wish to tackle, and to submit entries in accordance with such event regulations.

[1.9] If, for reasons outside the control of ANWCC, a competitor is unable to compete on an event the rule of "Force Majeure" will apply. e.g. local travel restrictions such as applied during COVID-19 pandemic.

[1.10] Event organisers will be supplied, on request, with details of appropriate ANWCC Championship contenders, subject to any restrictions under GDPR (see our Privacy Policy on our website). The list of names and numbers will be published on the website.

[1.11] Competitors should indicate on their entry form for events that they are ANWCC Championship contenders and quote their ANWCC Championship Registration Number.

[1.12] Registration Cards should be shown at signing-on for events. It will not be necessary to sign-on at each event specifically for championship points.

[1.13] Acceptance of entries to individual events will be at the discretion of the event organisers, and the ANWCC cannot be held responsible for any entries refused.

[1.14] Points will be scored on each qualifying event as detailed under specific championship regulations. See Appendix A detailing the points scoring systems for the various disciplines.

[1.15] Points will be allocated automatically - no claims are necessary. Exception is for the Allrounders events not in a main championship (Regulation 16.9) and Marshals Championship points for any event (Regulation 17.3), whereby claims must be submitted within 14 days.

[1.16] Registered Championship contenders who officiate on a qualifying round, that is a round of the championship entered, may claim a score equal to 50% of the points awarded for first overall in each category entered of the championship for which that event qualifies. Championship contenders who take on an official role, on such an event, and named in the event regulations may claim a score equal to 75% of the points awarded for first overall in each category entered of the championship for which that event qualifies. Such points must be claimed, and proof of officiating may be requested, using the online form on our website, within 7 days of the event. Maximum of 2 such claims per year.

[1.17] The number of scores to count towards the competitors final total will be calculated as shown below:

* Exception is for the Allrounders Championship - See separate regulation 16.

In the event of there being less than three events run in a championship, then that championship will be cancelled and awards will not be presented. Relevant competitors will be offered a free championship registration fee for the following championship year.

Allrounders, Ladies Rally and Inter-Club points gained on events that are held, but in a championship that is cancelled, will still count for Allrounders, Ladies Rally and Inter-Club championships as appropriate.

[1.18] In the event of a tie, competitors will be placed equally and awarded identical trophies. Named awards will be retained for a proportionally equal period of time.

[1.19] Championship results will be published as soon as possible after each qualifying round on www.anwcc.co.uk

[1.20] An appeal against points awarded (or not awarded) in a Championship must be lodged in writing within 7 days of the first publication of the points in dispute on the website or in an official document (e.g. interim championship results, programme, etc.) - Motorsport UK NCR 2.5.2.

[1.21] Competitors winning an overall award (Champion or Runner-Up) will not be eligible for a class or category award. This does not include awards in the following categories: Junior, Senior, Front-Wheel-Drive, Rear-Wheel-Drive, Road Rally <1400cc, <1000cc, "English" and "Welsh" awards.

[1.22] Awards, in the form of trophies, will be presented to the successful ANWCC Championship contenders at the ANWCC Awards Presentation evening to be held in early 2027, details will be issued later.

The SD34 Group of clubs (all of which are members of ANWCC) will also present awards to their successful competitors, see Appendix C of these regulations. For full details and to register visit website www.sd34msg.org.uk

Other member clubs may also use our championships on which to base awards for their successful competitors.

[1.23] To be eligible for an award a competitor must have started a minimum of four events qualifying for that award. However, if a championship has less than ten events then the minimum number shall be as shown in regulation 1.17.

[1.24] The Championship Stewards shall be the ANWCC Chairman (Mark Wilkinson), ANWCC Vice-Chairman (John Harden), ANWCC Treasurer (Jim Spencer) or the person(s) in those roles at the time of an enquiry. Another member club official may be appointed as substitute if necessary.

[2] STAGE RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP

[2.1] For list of qualifying rounds please refer to the Championship Calendar 2026, published on our website.

[2.2] Competitors will be divided into classes based on the actual engine size of the car in which they are competing.

[2.3] The classes for the Championship will be (A) 4WD Cars with engine size >2000cc and WRC Cars regardless of engine size; (B) 2WD Cars with engine size >2000cc; (C) Cars with engine size 1601 to 2000cc inclusive; (D) Cars with engine size 1401 to 1600cc inclusive; (E) Cars with engine size 1001 to 1400cc; (F) Cars with engine size up to and including 1000cc. Cars fitted with forced-induction systems and/or rotary engines will be classified as having an engine capacity increase of 70% in accordance with Motorsport UK NCR 7.2.8.2.

(Only change is the class lettering, reversed to line up with current classes)

[2.4] Points for the Championship will be scored as detailed in Appendix A, System A.

[2.5] If event classes differ from Championship classes then class placings will be revised to suit the Championship, for points scoring calculations.

[2.6] Trophies will be presented to the 1st & 2nd Overall Drivers & Co-Drivers; 1st & 2nd in class Drivers & Co-Drivers; 1st & 2nd Junior Driver & Co-Driver (under 25 as at 1 January 2026); 1st Senior Driver & Co-Driver (over 65 as at 1 January 2026). Trophies will also be presented to the 1st & 2nd Novice Drivers & Co-Drivers.

[3] NORTH WALES STAGE CHALLENGE

[3.1] For list of qualifying rounds please refer to the Championship Calendar 2026, published on our website.

[3.2] Competitors will be divided into classes as per Stage Rally Championship regulation 2.2 and 2.3 above.

[3.3] Points for the Championship will be scored as detailed in Appendix A, System B.

[3.4] If event classes differ from Championship classes then class placings will be revised to suit the Championship, for points scoring calculations.

[3.5] Trophies will be presented to the 1st & 2nd Overall Driver & Co-Driver; 1st & 2nd in class Driver & Co-Driver; 1st Junior Driver & Co-Driver (under 25 as at 1 January 2026).

[4] FOREST STAGE RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP

[4.1] For list of qualifying rounds please refer to the Championship Calendar 2026, published on our website.

[4.2] Competitors will be divided into classes based on the actual engine size of the car in which they are competing.

[4.3] The classes for the Championship will be (A) 4WD Cars with engine size >2000cc and WRC Cars regardless of engine size; (B) 2WD Cars with engine size >2000cc; (C) Cars with engine size 1601 to 2000cc inclusive; (D) Cars with engine size 1401 to 1600cc inclusive; (E) Cars with engine size 1001 to 1400cc; (F) Cars with engine size up to and including 1000cc. Cars fitted with forced-induction systems and/or rotary engines will be classified as having an engine capacity increase of 70% in accordance with Motorsport UK NCR 7.2.8.2.

(Only change is the class lettering, reversed to line up with current classes)

[4.4] Where an event is run under a dual-permit (e.g. National and Interclub, or

Historic and Modern) the Championship will be based on that part of the event that is run for Interclub section, taking all competitors who tackled those stages into account.

[4.5] An ANWCC competitor in the higher status part of a dual-permit event will be deemed to have an overall penalty sustained on that part of the event that is common - calculations will be made from the official published results.

[4.6] Points for the Championship will be scored as detailed in Appendix A, System B.

[4.7] If event classes differ from Championship classes then class placings will be revised to suit the Championship, for points scoring calculations.

[4.8] Trophies will be presented to the 1st & 2nd Overall Drivers & Co-Drivers; 1st & 2nd in class Drivers & Co-Drivers; 1st & 2nd Junior Driver & Co-Driver (under 25 as at 1 January 2026); 1st Senior Driver & Co-Driver (over 65 as at 1 January 2026); 1st Front and Rear-wheel-drive Driver & Co-Driver. Trophies will also be presented to the 1st & 2nd overall Novice Driver & Co-Driver.

[5] MINI COOPER CHALLENGE in association with MRCC

[5.1] See Appendix B for full regulations for this series.

[6] ROAD & NAVIGATION RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP

[6.1] For list of qualifying rounds please refer to the Championship Calendar 2026, published on our website.

[6.2] Competitors will be divided into classes dependent on previous success in the capacity now entered:

MASTERS: competitors who have won an Interclub, National B or Restricted status Road Rally;

EXPERTS: competitors who have finished in the top 10 of an Interclub, National B or Restricted status Road Rally;

SEMI-EXPERTS: competitors who have finished in the top 3 in class on an Interclub, National B or Restricted status Road Rally;

NOVICES: competitors who have finished more than one Interclub, National B or Restricted status Road Rally;

BEGINNERS: competitors who have not finished more than one Interclub, National B or Restricted status Road Rally.

[6.3] A competitor's class will be the highest for which he/she qualifies at the time of registration. For the purpose of championship awards a competitor will retain their class

status until the conclusion of the championship, regardless of any promotion earned during the year.

[6.4] Competitors competing in a car of less than 1400cc will automatically be entered for the <1400cc class awards.

[6.5] Points for the Championship will be scored as detailed in Appendix A, System C.

[6.6] Where, on an event, a class does not complete the whole route (e.g. shorter route for Novice crews) any ANWCC registered contender in that class will be credited with points based on their performance as at the point where common routes finish.

[6.7] Trophies will be presented to the 1st & 2nd Overall Driver & Navigator; 1st & 2nd in class Driver & Navigator; 1st & 2nd Junior Driver & Navigator (under 25 as at 1 January 2026); 1st Senior Driver & Navigator (over 65 as at 1 January 2026); 1st <1400cc Driver & Navigator; 1st "English" Driver & Navigator on "Welsh" events, 1st "Welsh" Driver & Navigator on "English" events - see regulations 6.8 to 6.9.

[6.8] English and Welsh events are defined in the list of qualifying events by means of E (English) or W (Welsh), based on their geographical location.

[6.9] For the purpose of determining nationality, the competitors home address will be taken. Competitors with an address outside England and Wales will qualify for both awards.

[6.10] Competitors should note that championship rounds taking place in whole or in part within areas policed by any of the Welsh Constabularies require tyres to be E-marked.

[7] NORTH WALES ROAD RALLY CHALLENGE

[7.1] For list of qualifying rounds please refer to the Championship Calendar 2026, published on our website.

[7.2] Competitors will be divided into classes as per Road Rally Championship regulation 6.2 and 6.3 above.

[7.3] Points for the Championship will be scored as detailed in Appendix A, System B.

[7.4] Where, on an event, a class does not complete the whole route (e.g. shorter route for Novice crews) any ANWCC registered contender in that class will be credited with points based on their performance as at the point where common routes finish.

[7.5] Trophies will be presented to the 1st & 2nd Overall Driver & Navigator; 1st & 2nd in

class Driver & Navigator; 1st <1400cc Driver & Navigator; 1st Junior Driver & Navigator (under 25 as at 1 January 2026).

[7.6] Competitors should note that championship rounds taking place in whole or in part within areas policed by any of the Welsh Constabularies require tyres to be E-marked.

[8] TARGA ROAD RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP

[8.1] For list of qualifying rounds please refer to the Championship Calendar 2026, published on our website.

[8.2] Competitors will be divided into classes dependent on previous success in the capacity now entered:

EXPERTS: competitors who have finished in the top 5 of a Targa Road Rally;

SEMI-EXPERTS: competitors who do not qualify as Expert or Novice;

NOVICES: competitors who have not won more than one class award on a Targa Road Rally of Interclub status.

[8.3] A competitor's class will be the highest for which he/she qualifies at the time of registration. For the purpose of championship awards a competitor will retain their class status until the conclusion of the championship, regardless of any promotion earned during the year.

[8.4] Points for the Championship will be scored as detailed in Appendix A, System B.

[8.5] Trophies will be presented to the 1st & 2nd Overall Driver & Navigator; 1st & 2nd in class Driver & Navigator; 1st & 2nd Junior Driver & Navigator (under 25 as at 1 January 2026); 1st Senior Driver & Navigator (over 65 as at 1 January 2026).

[8.6] Competitors should note that championship rounds taking place in whole or in part within areas policed by any of the Welsh Constabularies require tyres to be E-marked.

[9] HISTORIC ROAD RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP

[9.1] For list of qualifying rounds please refer to the Championship Calendar 2026, published on our website.

[9.2] Definition of eligible cars is as per Motorsport UK NCR 13.15.

[9.3] Competitors will be divided into classes dependent on previous success in the capacity now entered:

EXPERTS: competitors who have finished in the top 5 of a Historic Road Rally;

SEMI-EXPERTS: competitors who do not qualify as Expert or Novice;

NOVICES: competitors who have not won more than one class award on a Targa Road Rally of Interclub status.

[9.4] For the purpose of championship awards a competitor will retain their class status until the conclusion of the championship, regardless of any promotion earned during the year.

[9.5] Where a Historic Road Rally Championship event is run alongside a rally for other vehicles (e.g. Modern or Endurance), competitors must compete in the Historic Rally classes to be eligible for ANWCC Historic Road Rally Championship points.

[9.6] Points for the Championship will be scored as detailed in Appendix A, System B.

[9.7] Trophies will be presented to the 1st & 2nd Overall Driver & Navigator; 1st & 2nd in class Driver & Navigator; 1st & 2nd Junior Driver & Navigator (under 25 as at 1 January 2026); 1st Senior Driver & Navigator (over 65 as at 1 January 2026).

[9.8] Competitors should note that championship rounds taking place in whole or in part within areas policed by any of the Welsh Constabularies require tyres to be E-marked.

[10] LADIES RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP

[10.1] All Rallies qualifying for any of the ANWCC Rally Championships 2026 will be qualifying rounds.

[10.2] All Lady competitors who are registered for any 2026 ANWCC Rally Championship will be credited with Drivers and/or Co-Driver/Navigator points as appropriate.

[10.3] Points for the Championship will be scored as detailed in Appendix A, System D.

[10.4] Trophies will be presented to the 1st & 2nd Overall Lady Driver and Lady Co-Driver/Navigator.

[11] AUTOTEST CHAMPIONSHIP

[11.1] For list of qualifying rounds please refer to the Championship Calendar 2026, published on our website.

[11.2] Classes will be as follows:

- (A) Saloon cars, that are not taxed or tested;
- (B) Sports cars and Specials
- (C) Road-going saloon cars – being defined as cars that are fully road legal. Including Electric Vehicles (EV) as per Motorsport UK NCR 19.3.1.4.

[11.3] Points for the Championship will be scored as detailed in Appendix A, System B.

[11.4] It should be noted that competitors on Clubman status events require a Competition Licence of minimum grade RS Clubman.

[11.5] Trophies will be presented to the 1st & 2nd Overall; 1st & 2nd in each class; 1st & 2nd Junior (under 25 as at 1 January 2026); 1st Senior (over 65 as at 1 January 2026). Trophies will also be presented to the 1st & 2nd overall Novice competitors.

[12] PRODUCTION CAR AUTOTEST CHAMPIONSHIP

[12.1] For list of qualifying rounds please refer to the Championship Calendar 2026, published on our website.

[12.2] Classes will be as follows:

(A) Competitors under 17 (as at 1.1.2026) in cars of engine capacity under 1400cc;

(B) Competitors under 17 (as at 1.1.2026) in cars of engine capacity over 1400cc;

(C) Competitors aged 17 to 24 (as at 1.1.2026) in cars of engine capacity under 1400cc;

(D) Competitors aged 17 to 24 (as at 1.1.2026) in cars of engine capacity over 1400cc;

(E) Competitors aged 25 and over (as at 1.1.2026)

All classes may include Electric Vehicles (EVs) as per Motorsport UK NCR 19.3.1.4.

Competitors in classes A and B must be accompanied by a Driver with motorsport experience and a dual-controlled car is recommended.

[12.3] Points for the Championship will be scored as detailed in Appendix A, System B.

[12.4] It should be noted that competitors on Clubman status events require a Competition Licence of minimum grade RS Clubman. This includes passengers.

[12.5] Trophies will be presented to the 1st Overall; 1st Under 17 (Classes A & B); 1st Under 25 (Classes C & D); 1st & 2nd in each class.

[13] AUTOSOLO CHAMPIONSHIP

[13.1] For list of qualifying rounds please refer to the Championship Calendar 2026, published on our website.

[13.2] Competitors will be divided into classes. Lengths will be determined by reference to www.parkers.co.uk/car-specs/

(A) Production Saloon Cars up to 4.15m (13'7") overall length and up to 1400cc (Must have all seats & trim fitted);

(B) Production Saloon Cars up to 4.15m (13'7") overall length and over 1400cc (Must have all seats & trim fitted);

(C) Production Saloon Cars over 4.15m (13'7") overall length (Must have all seats & trim fitted);

(D) Series Production Sports Cars hood down or hood up;

(E) All other cars (including "low volume" sports cars e.g. Caterhams, Westfields) and Stage Rally-prepared cars.

Classes A, B, C and D may include Electric Vehicles (EVs) as per Motorsport UK NCR 19.3.1.4.

Rotary-engined cars will have their engine cubic capacity increased by 50%. Forced-induction diesel engine cars will not be subject to a capacity increase. Motorsport UK NCR 7.2.8.2 amended.

The carrying of a passenger may be optional if allowed subject to Motorsport UK and supplementary regulations, this will not alter the class.

[13.3] Points for the Championship will be scored as detailed in Appendix A, System B.

[13.4] It should be noted that competitors on Clubman status events require a Competition Licence of minimum grade RS Clubman. This includes passengers.

[13.5] Trophies will be presented to the 1st & 2nd Overall; 1st & 2nd in each class; 1st & 2nd Junior (under 25 as at 1 January 2026); 1st Senior (over 65 as at 1 January 2026). Trophies will also be presented to the 1st & 2nd overall Novice competitors.

[14] CAR TRIALS CHAMPIONSHIP

[14.1] For list of qualifying rounds please refer to the Championship Calendar 2026, published on our website.

[14.2] Competitors will be divided into classes as defined in Appendix D of these regulations. Classes will be in line with those for the Motorsport UK British and BTRDA Trials Championships.

[14.3] Points for the Championship will be scored as detailed in Appendix A, System B.

[14.4] It should be noted that competitors on Clubman status events require a Competition Licence of minimum grade RS Clubman. This includes passengers.

[14.5] Trophies will be presented to the 1st & 2nd Overall; 1st & 2nd in each class; 1st & 2nd Junior (under 25 as at 1 January 2026); 1st

Senior (over 65 as at 1 January 2026). Trophies will also be presented to the 1st & 2nd overall Novice competitors.

[15] SPEED CHAMPIONSHIP

[15.1] For list of qualifying rounds please refer to the Championship Calendar 2026, published on our website.

[15.2] Points for the Championship will be scored as detailed in Appendix A, System E.

[15.3] All vehicles must comply with Motorsport UK NCR Ch 14 for Sprints & Hillclimbs.

[15.4] Categories will be as per Motorsport UK NCR Ch 14.4.1, but most events will run classes as agreed for the "2026 North & Midland Speed Classes" (see Appendix E)

Category S - Standard Cars complying with Motorsport UK NCR 14.4.13.

Category 1 – Road Cars (series production) complying with Motorsport UK NCR 14.4.14.

Category 2 - Road Cars (specialist production) complying with Motorsport UK NCR 14.4.14.

Category 3 - Modified Cars – series and specialist production complying with Motorsport UK NCR 14.4.15.

Category 4 - Sports Libre Cars complying with Motorsport UK NCR 14.4.16.

Category 5 - Racing Cars complying with Motorsport UK NCR 14.4.17.

Note: Scrutineers and Championship Officials reserve the right to check all road-going competition vehicles' taxation status via the DVLA website to ensure compliance with championship regulations.

It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that all data held by the DVLA is accurate for the vehicle being entered into competition.

ANWCC Championship Competitors competing in a Specialist class (e.g. Classic Marques, Morgan, Lotus, Rally, Austin 7, Veteran/Vintage) will be reallocated to the appropriate championship class for calculation of points only.

Where a Championship round does not adhere to the Championship class structure or the technical regulations of the Championship classes then points awarded to Championship drivers will be calculated, as far as practicable, as though the Championship classes existed at that event.

[15.5] Trophies will be presented to the 1st Overall (to qualify a competitor must have started at least one Sprint and one Hillclimb); 1st Overall Sprints and 1st Overall Hillclimbs (in that order and will not be eligible for a category award); 1st & 2nd in each category; 1st & 2nd Junior (under 25 as at 1 January 2026); 1st Senior (over 65 as at 1 January 2026); 1st & 2nd overall Novice competitors.

[16] ALLROUNDERS CHAMPIONSHIP

[16.1] All competitors registering for a 2026 ANWCC Championship will automatically be eligible for the ANWCC Allrounders Championship.

[16.2] Qualifying rounds shall be all events which are run by a member club of the ANWCC and which are of a minimum of Interclub status, plus Clubman events that qualify for a named ANWCC Championship.

[16.3] Rally Drivers and Co-Driver/ Navigators will be scored separately.

[16.4] The separate disciplines for the purpose of the Allrounders Championship are: (a) Stage Rally Driver, (b) Stage Rally Co-Driver, (c) Rally Time Trial Driver, (d) Rally Time Trial Co-Driver, (e) Forest Rally Driver, (f) Forest Rally Co-Driver, (g) Road & Navigation Rally Driver, (h) Road & Navigation Rally Navigator, (i) Historic Road Rally Driver, (j) Historic Road Rally Navigator, (k) Historic Stage Rally Driver, (l) Historic Stage Rally Co-Driver, (m) Targa Road Rally Driver, (n) Targa Road Rally Navigator, (o) Autotest, (p) Production Car Autotests, (q) Autosolo, (r) Car Trials, (s) Sprint, (t) Hillclimb, (u) Sporting Car Trials, (v) Race, (w) Promotional and Taster events.

[16.5] Points for the Championship will be scored as detailed in Appendix A, System F.

[16.6] A competitor's best ten scores during the Championship year will count towards the final total, except that not more than six scores will be taken from any one discipline. (e.g. a competitor may qualify by driving on a Stage Rally, driving on a Forest Rally, and navigating on a Road Rally; or qualification can be made by driving on a Hillclimb and Autotest and navigating on a Historic Road Rally). For discipline (w) the maximum number of scores will be four. Regulation 1.16 does not apply to the Allrounders Championship.

[16.7] To qualify for an award, a competitor must have started (but not necessarily be classified as a finisher) in a minimum of three disciplines during the year.

[16.8] For events which are NOT a qualifying round of a named ANWCC Championship (see 16.2), a claim for points has to be submitted to the ANWCC Championship Secretary, by sending a copy of the entry list and results for the event. Competitors claiming under discipline (w) must also make a claim in accordance with this regulation, 16.9 and 16.10.

[16.9] Claims under regulation 16.8 must be made within 14 days of the event being held. If printed results are not available a provisional claim must be made, to be followed with printed results when available.

[16.10] Claims can be made by mail, e-Mail, telephone or text to the Championship Co-Ordinator.

[16.11] Trophies will be presented to the 1st & 2nd overall; 1st & 2nd Junior (under 25 as at 1 January 2026); 1st & 2nd Qualifier using car(s) of up to 1000cc; 1st Junior Driver (under 25 as at 1 January 2026 counting events driven on only) – the Roger Barfield Memorial Trophy; 2nd Junior Driver (under 25 as at 1 January 2026 counting events driven on only); 1st Senior (over 65 as at 1 January 2026).

[17] MARSHALS CHAMPIONSHIP

[17.1] The Association of North-Western Car Clubs organizes a Marshals Championship, covering all events organised by member clubs of the ANWCC.

[17.2] Anyone who officiates or assists in the running of an event by an ANWCC member club is eligible for the ANWCC Marshals monthly draw, plus all attended (not online) Training Sessions. Membership of a motor club is not necessary.

[17.3] Contenders will be required to claim points by submitting it to the ANWCC Championship Secretary within one month of the event, with a final cut-off date of midnight on 8th December 2026. Claims should be submitted using the online claim facility on our website. Claims by e-mail, post or text (07788 995345) may also be accepted.

[17.4] Contenders will be required to supply their name, address, telephone number, e-mail address, club (if applicable) and Motorsport UK Marshals Registration Number (if appropriate). This information will be held on computer and made available to organizers, unless the contender opts out under the GDPR (General Data Protection Regulation) and Data Protection Acts 2018 by giving written notice.

[17.5] Points for the Championship will be scored as detailed in Appendix A, System G.

[17.6] Random checks will be made to ensure that claims are valid. Any claim found to be invalid will render that Marshal ineligible for any awards and will be disqualified from the championship, and liable to repay any winnings gained.

[17.7] Points for Marshalling cannot be claimed for both competing and officiating on

the same event, competitor points will be allocated.

[17.8] Points will be published at regular intervals on www.anwcc.co.uk

[17.9] A prize fund has been set up and it is anticipated that competitors and supporting companies will contribute to the fund, this fund will be used for the monthly draws and for end-of-year prizes to the top marshals.

[17.10] A monthly draw will be held, from all claims received during a calendar month, with a cash prize being awarded to a lucky winner. The draw will take place after each month – all claims will be numbered in order of receipt and the winning number will be based on the next Lotto draw – full details available on request. Winners will be contacted and listed on www.anwcc.co.uk/Marshals website page.

[17.11] Prize-money remaining in the account after deduction of the monthly prizes will be distributed to the top ten marshals in proportion to the number of points scored.

[17.12] In addition to the prize-fund, awards will be presented at the conclusion of the championship year to the top marshals. The overall winner will be presented with the Cath Simpson Memorial Trophy to be retained for 11 months, or to be returned on demand. Also award to the top Junior marshal (under 21 years of age as at 1st January 2026).

[18] CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

[18.1] On each championship event the points scored by each club's registered competitor will be totalled.

[18.2] The club with the highest aggregate total will be awarded 10 points, next 9, etc. down to 1 point for the 10th placed club.

[18.3] All Championship qualifying events will count towards the Club's final score.

[18.4] The winning Club will be presented with the McGivern Trophy plus souvenir awards for the club to be allocated to their officials as deemed appropriate.

[19] NOVICE CLASSIFICATION

[19.1] Except for sections 6 (Road & Navigation, 7 (NW Road) and 8 (Targa Road) a Novice competitor is defined as one who, in the role and discipline now entered, has not won more than one class or overall award on an event of Interclub (formerly National B) or higher status, at the time of registering for the Championship. Claims for Novice status must be indicated on the Championship Registration Form. Marque, Ladies, Mixed Crew, Club and Team awards are discounted for the purpose of Novice definition.

[19.2] Previous winners of an ANWCC Championship will not be eligible for Novice status regardless of regulation 19.1 above.

Points for the Overall Championship will be scored on the basis of 75 for 1st in event overall classification, 74 for 2nd, etc., down to 1 point for 75th place PLUS points for class position (using ANWCC championship classes) on the basis of 50 points for 1st, 48 for 2nd, etc. down to 2 points for 25th place, taking all competitors into account.

Points for the individual Class Championships will be scored on the basis of 50 points for 1st, 48 for 2nd, etc. down to 2 points for 25th place, taking all competitors into account.

Points system B – for

North Wales Stage Rally Challenge [3.3]

Forest Stage Rally Championship [4.6]

North Wales Road Rally Challenge [7.3]

Targa Road Rally Championship [8.4]

Historic Road Rally Championship [9.7]

Points will be scored on the basis of 25 for 1st eligible Driver and Co-Driver in event overall classification, 22 for 2nd, 20 for 3rd, 18 for 4th, 16 for 5th, then 15-14-13 down to 1 point for 20th place ... PLUS class points on the basis of 15-12-10-8-6-5-4-3-2-1 to the top 10 Driver and Co-Driver registered championship competitors in each class. All finishers 5 points, all starters 5 points. Points are cumulative to maximum is 50.

Points for the individual Class Championships will be scored on the basis of 15-12-10-etc as above.

Points system C – for

Road Rally Championship [6.5]

Points for the Overall Championship will be scored on the basis of 75 for 1st in event overall classification, 74 for 2nd, etc., down to 1 point for 75th place PLUS points for class position (based on the event classes) on the basis of 25 points for 1st, 24 for 2nd, etc. down to 1 point for 25th place, taking all competitors into account.

Points for the individual Class Championships will be scored on the basis of 25-24-etc as above, taking all competitors into account.

Points system D – for

Ladies Rally Championship [10.3]

Points score will use formula

$$\left(\frac{\text{Total Starters} + 1 - \text{Overall Position}}{\text{Total Starters}} \right) \times 100$$

Points system E – for

Speed Championship [15.2]

Points will be scored on the basis of overall points, plus bonus points, as follows:

Overall points – competitor's fastest time will be calculated as a percentage of the second fastest time in class (and score 100) up to a maximum of 103 if more than 2 class contenders, 101 if only 2 class contenders (see also Specialist class scoring below). If only 1 class contender then the points will be 100.

Plus bonus points calculated on the basis of 0.2 point for each competitor beaten in class, to a maximum of 1.0 points, as per table below:

Points will be scored on the basis of 15 points for 1st in class, 14 for 2nd, etc. down to 1 point for 15th place, taking all competitors into account and based on individual event classes. For events in discipline (w) the score will be 10 points.

Points system G – for

Marshals Championship [17.5]

Points will be scored on the following basis:

- (A) Officiating or Marshalling on an ANWCC Championship qualifying event (except Allrounders) ... 5 pts
- (B) Attendance at an attended (not online) Training Day organised by or in conjunction with the ANWCC or an ANWCC member club ... 4 pts
- (C) Officiating or Marshalling on a non-championship Interclub, or higher grade, event organised by an ANWCC member club ... 3 pts
- (D) Officiating or Marshalling on a non-championship Clubman status event organised by an ANWCC member club ... 2 pts
- (E) Officiating or Marshalling on an event organised by an ANWCC member club that is held over more than 24 hours ... 1 bonus point.

The Mini Rally Challenge is a championship organised by the Making Rallying Cheaper Club (MRCC) and run under ANWCC. It is administered in accordance with the General Regulations of the Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Championship Regulations.

The Organisers reserve the right to issue additional statements clarifying items in the rules and regulations, and all such statements will be issued to all registered Drivers by either post / email / other communication, or by means of a Technical Bulletin to all registered competitors.

Any protest must be referred in writing, and provided to the Mini Rally Challenge Committee either in person or via email, within the time limits in accordance with the Motorsport UK NCR Chapter 2 together with the appropriate fee. (Chapter 1 Appendix 2).

ELIGIBILITY

The Championship is open to crews with the appropriate valid Motorsport UK Stage Rally Licences, who are Members of an ANWCC affiliated Club and registered Mini Rally Challenge contenders for 2026. These prerequisites will be checked and are mandatory for either of the team to score points.

By making payment for your entry to the Mini Rally Challenge Championship, you confirm that you agree to abide by the rules of the Championship Regulations.

Acceptance of a championship entry is at the discretion of the Championship Committee.

In accordance with Motorsport UK NCR 3.10.4.1(d) the organisers reserve the right to amend the published list of dates and rounds, in which case, all registered competitors will be informed of the amendments by way of an Official Bulletin.

If through "Force Majeure" any of the qualifying rounds cannot take place, then the Mini Rally Challenge reserves the right to either include a replacement event, or to alter the number of best scores to count as follows:

10 events – 6 best scores
9 events – 6 best scores
8 events – 6 best scores
7 events – 5 best scores

Once Event Regulations have been published, testing at Championship venues, including Track Days, is forbidden. Photographers are present at test days and if caught and you compete on the

mentioned event, points will automatically be forfeited.

Being a registered MRC contender does not guarantee an entry on any event and we recommend an entry is made at the opening time on the opening date.

THE CARS

R50 BMW Mini Cooper up to 2006 using the Tritec Chrysler engines.

R53 BMW Mini Cooper S up to 2006 using the Tritec Chrysler engines.

No JCW or GP1 cars are eligible, nor are any JCW or GP1 parts allowed to be fitted to cars.

Cars must comply with the 2026 Motorsport UK NCRs, Stage Rallying passport section and meet the Road Traffic Act 1988 regulations. All cars must also be issued with a MRC car passport to be kept with the vehicle at all times.

1. ENGINE

- 1.1 Induction Kit may be fitted.
- 1.2 Exhaust system may be replaced, but retaining the OE catalytic converter manifold.
- 1.3 Exhaust flexi may be removed and refitted after the OEM cat, it must be carried out as demonstrated in fig.1 at the bottom of the regs.
- 1.4 Mountings may be uprated.
- 1.5 Extra engine stabiliser may be fitted.
- 1.6 Water expansion tank may be moved and uprated.
- 1.7 Air Condition equipment may be removed.
- 1.8 Engines may be sealed. Two bolts on the rear of the camshaft cover box must be drilled to allow for sealing. Once engines are sealed, if repairs are required where as the seal needs to be broken. The championship committee are to be notified of the reason and what work is to be carried out and photographic recording may be requested. Once the work is complete the engine will be resealed at the next event. Any removed parts must be retained until the end of the season.
- 1.9 Silicone coolant hoses may be used, if they adhere to the original OEM specifications.

R53

- 1.10 KAVS 17% reduction supercharger pulley may be fitted. Part numbers 6PK843 or 6PK1360
- 1.11 Direnza top mounted Intercooler may be fitted.
- 1.12 Water Oil Cooler and associated pipes may be replaced with the R50 type.
- 1.13 NGK BCR8ES Spark plugs may be fitted.

2. FUEL

- 2.1 Permitted Fuels - Competitors are permitted to use fuel that conforms to the definitions of Pump Fuel in the 2026 Motorsport UK NCRs or fuel that complies with FIA Appendix J, Art 252, Art 9.
- 2.2 Fuel additives are not permitted for use.

3. GEARBOX

- 3.1 Gearboxes may be sealed. Two bolts in close proximity must be drilled to allow for sealing.
- 3.2 Blackline Geared helical LSD art number HLF015 may be fitted for R53 and 6 speed R50s. Black line helical LSD part number HLF051 or Quaif

ATB LSD part number QDF9H/MG for 5 speed R50 may be fitted.

3.3 A championship Questmead supplied performance clutch may be fitted.

3.4 Uprated gearbox mounting bushes and mountings may be fitted.

R50

3.5 Gearbox choices, Midland - Getrag 5 speed or Getrag 6 speed (codes BKD, BKE or BKL).

R53

3.6 Gearbox codes allowed are BKD, BKE or BKL.

4. SUSPENSION

- 4.1 Championship supplied dampers and springs must be fitted. Only the current R53 kit will be supplied in 2026 for both R50 and R53 categories, however R50 class cars that were originally built using the R50 suspension kit (built pre 2023) are permitted to use their original suspension.
- 4.2 Steering wheel may be replaced.
- 4.3 Uprated bushes may be fitted throughout.
- 4.4 Wheel stud and nut conversion may be fitted.
- 4.5 Wheel spacers may be fitted to a max of 20mm.
- 4.6 Strengthened rear lower track control arms may be used (no Rose Joints).
- 4.7 Power steering reservoir may be moved.
- 4.8 Front upper strut brace may be fitted and stiffening of the strut top, and a reinforcement plate for the front shock top mounting point, is allowed.
- 4.9 A bracket may be fabricated around the lower connecting bolt on the rear shock absorbers for the purpose of reinforcing the bolt only. As per the example shown in fig 2.

5. ELECTRICAL

- 5.1 Battery may be moved and replaced by gel type.
- 5.2 ECU may be mapped.

6. BODY & TRIM

- 6.1 Trim and sound proofing may be removed, but no body lightening is allowed.
- 6.2 Rear parcel shelf metal supports may be removed to allow access.
- 6.3 Seam welding is not allowed unless approved with the series co-ordinators.
- 6.4 The alloy radiator protection member may be removed.
- 6.5 Air Bags may be removed.
- 6.6 Foot trays may be fitted.
- 6.7 Bonnet and Tailgate pins may be fitted.
- 6.8 Door cards may be fitted.
- 6.9 Roof Vent may be fitted.
- 6.10 Front Bumper spotlights may be removed.
- 6.11 Mounts may be fitted to the sill for sill mount stands.
- 6.12 Front side windows may be replaced with Lexan windows.
- 6.13 All cars must always be carrying a spare tyre.
- 6.14 For those who wish to opt for a weld-in roll cage in a challenge car, must submit the cage design to the championship eligibility scrutineer before installation. This is to ensure the cage design has no purpose other than to provide safety to the crew inside.

7. BRAKES

- 7.1 Championship Questmead Branded MINTEX 166 F and 144 R must be fitted with MRC logo etching.
- 7.2 ABS system may be removed or disabled.
- 7.3 Hydraulic Handbrake may be fitted. (OE must be retained as per Road Traffic Act).
- 7.4 Brake Bias Valves may be fitted.
- 7.5 Brake Lines may be uprated and redirected through the cars interior.
- 7.6 Grooved and or drilled brake discs may be fitted.

8. WHEELS

- 8.1 Only 15" Diameter, with maximum width of 7.0 inches.

9. TYRES

- 9.1 R50 Asphalt 195.50.15 controlled Davanti.
- 9.2 R53 Asphalt 195.50.15 controlled Davanti Protourer.
- 9.3 Gravel 175.70x15 MRF tyres with MRC branding (MRF tyres without branding will be permitted for round 1 and 2 of the gravel championship). 10 tyres per season. All competitors will be given a form to keep tyre records for spot checks. If you do not keep track of your record slip, it will lead to a 10 point deduction.
- 9.4 Tyres are not to be tampered with or cut.

10. VEHICLE WEIGHT

- 10.1 A minimum weight, less crew but inclusive of spare wheel and tyre, of R50 1,075kg or R53 1,100kg. The Eligibility Scrutineer will designate the scales to be used for any post-race checks, and they will be deemed to be the Championship scales.

All cars must comply with the 2026 Motorsport UK NCRs, Stage Rallying passport section and meet the Road Traffic Act 1988 regulations.



12. ADVERTISING

Championship partners decals MUST be affixed at all times as follows -



- 11.1 Front Screen Sun Strip.
- 11.2 Partner door plate x2.
- 11.3 Rear quarter panel for MRC logo x2.
- 11.4 Front wing above the wheel arch for Davanti branding
- 11.5 Front of bonnet around grill
- 11.6 Door Number squares.

These will be supplied free to each competitor once, at the start of their season.

Decals must not be modified or altered. They can be trimmed where exceptionally necessary to fit the vehicle, but this must be approved by the Championship Co-ordinator and/or the Eligibility Scrutineer. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure the decals remain on the car. Failure to display decals will result in no point scored for any event they are not present on.

13 INSURANCE and LIABILITY

13.1 Competitors should make their own arrangements to ensure third party liability event cover.

14. CONDUCT

13.1 Where any reports of disrespectful conduct are judged to be well founded, the Championship organisers may issue warnings or require remedial actions and/or escalate to impose appropriate penalties which can include loss of Championship points and or event bans, through to Championship expulsion and referral to Motorsport UK.

The championship organisers will not tolerate abuse be it to Officials, fellow competitors or team members; this is inclusive of the behaviour of competitors friends and family and to like wise. This includes any actions leading to confrontation, and/or social media comments.

It is imperative that we promote the safety and wellbeing of young people and adults at risk. In addition to this all participants must be aware of their behaviour and conduct at all times, and abusive language and harmful behaviour will not be tolerated

15. POINTS & SCORING.

R50 and R53 Asphalt Cups - Best 4 of 5 rounds count

R50 and R53 Gravel Cups - Best 4 of 5 rounds count

R50 & R53 Mini Champions - best six scores (three Asphalt and three Gravel, including a Joker score if applicable). To qualify for the overall championship points must be scored in at least 3 asphalt and 3 gravel rounds

14.1 Points will be awarded - 1st R50 and R53, 25 points, 2nd 22, 3rd 19, 4th 17, 5th 16 down to 10th being 11 points all other finishers 8 points. DNF 6 points, unless you are disqualified in which case 0 points are awarded.

14.2 One Joker round, be it Asphalt or Gravel, where a competitor can gain the following extra points 1st 5 points, 2nd 4 points, 3rd 3 points, 4th 2 points, 5th 1 point. Your Joker must be registered prior to MC1 of the event you have chosen to play it, to Julia Perry or Adam Fern in writing and acknowledged. This can be text, Whatsapp or email. If you haven't played your Joker by the last round it is automatically added.

The Joker is ONLY effective on the overall Championship and does not apply to the single surface championship.

14.3 Championship points will be displayed on the MRC website (www.minirallychallenge.co.uk) after each event, and it is a championship contender's scores within their best six scores or four in relation to the single surface championship. In the event of a further tie the greatest number of second highest scores shall decide and so on. Should this fail to resolve the tie then reference will be made to the fastest time on the first stage of the last event in which both or all the competitors who have tied take part. If this fails to resolve the tie then joint awards will be presented.

14.5 Both Driver **and** Co-Driver in each car _ be registered in order to score points.

15. PENALTIES

15.1 For the breach of regulations, where we have not specified the penalty, the number of points will be determined not by reference to the type of offence, but the type of penalty imposed (c2.1.7), below is an example of how we might choose to apply penalties. However, we reserve the right to use our own discretion dependent on the severity of the regulations breach.

Verbal Warning accompanied by a Formal Written Warning – 0 to full points acquired on the corresponding round

Second formal written warning – The full points acquired on the corresponding round will be deducted.

Failure to comply after expiry of Second Formal written Warning deadline – Exclusion for the remainder of the season.

Any vehicle used by registered contenders may be subject to random eligibility checks throughout the year. These checks will be carried out by the Championship Scrutineer and/or members of the Motorsport UK Technical Commission, who shall be considered Judges of Fact in matters of eligibility. In the event of a car being found ineligible for any reason, then the penalties specified in Motorsport UK regulations (2.8.2) shall apply. The competitor will be responsible for any costs they incur as a result of eligibility checking whether found eligible or otherwise. Refusal to comply with eligibility checks will result in the exclusion from rounds or even the championship.

responsibility to check the championship points. Points tables will be final after seven days from the date of posting on the website if no queries are received.

14.4 Any ties will be decided in favour of the competitor with the greatest number of maximum. In the absence of an eligibility scrutineer and a breach of the regulations found. An organiser of the MRC can complete a form of fact with photographic evidence which is then signed by the competitor, organiser and witness, and these details passed to the eligibility scrutineer for referral.

ANWCC TRIALS CHAMPIONSHIP 2026 – Classes are in line with the BTRDA Trials Championships

Classes are in line with the BTRDA Trials Championships. Classes will be defined as per Motorsport UK NCR 17.4.

- (i) Car definitions to be in accordance with the current Motorsport UK NCR 1.1.
- (ii) Except as varied in these Rules, all cars must comply with NCR's Chapters 7 & 17.
- (iii) All cars to be 2-wheel-drive.
- (iv) Cars may be Front-wheel-drive or Rear-wheel-drive unless otherwise stated in the Class definition.
- (v) Series Production Cars includes Sports Cars with a minimum production run of 100 identical examples in any 12 consecutive month period.
- (vi) All cars to have an internal combustion engine as its sole means of propulsion whilst competing.
- (vii) There is no requirement for cars in any Class to be driven to the event; cars in Classes A, B C & D) do not need to be taxed or have a current MOT certificate.
- (viii) Cars in Classes S, A, B & C) must only use gear and axle ratios as stated in the official manufacturer's handbook for the model and year of manufacture. Cars in Class D must have an overall first gear ratio which is numerically less than 20:1.
- (ix) Cars in S, A, B & C) must have rear seats fitted in the same way as originally supplied.
- (x) Cars in any Class may have a steering wheel knob fitted.
- (xi) Minimum tyre pressures on the driven wheels are noted in each Class section below. FWD cars in Classes S, A, & B) with an overall length of 166 inches and over may reduce tyre pressures below the stated Class pressures by not more than 4 psi, subject to an absolute minimum pressure of 12 psi.
- (xii) Any car fitted with a torque biasing differential or any other form of mechanical traction control as catalogued for that car will have tyre pressures set at 4 psi above the specified Class pressure. Any car fitted with an unmodified original equipment electronic traction control system will be allowed without the 4 psi tyre pressure penalty.

CLASS S - 2009 onwards standard Series Production Cars, unmodified and carrying no ballast.

Standard road-going front or rear wheel drive cars first registered on or after 1 January 2009*, taxed for road use, carrying no ballast and having no modifications except as follows:

Front wheel drive cars of any age, carrying no ballast and having no modifications except as follows:

- (a) the fitting of under-body protection weighing no more than 10kg (including fittings);
- (b) the replacement of wheels and/or tyres in accordance with Motorsport UK NCR 17.4.8.2 and NCR 17.4.3.

Minimum tyre pressures - see also Class Definitions (xi) & (xii): FWD: Up to 1200cc - 12 psi; 1201–1400cc - 14 psi; 1401-1600cc - 16 psi; 1601-1800 – 18psi; over 1800cc – 20psi.

CLASS B – Modified FWD Series Production Cars

Permitted modifications in accordance with Motorsport UK NCR 17.4.2.1 to 17.4.10.5.

Minimum tyre pressures - see also Class Definitions (xi) & (xii): FWD: Up to 1200cc - 12 psi; 1201–1400cc - 14 psi; 1401-1600cc - 16 psi; 1601-1800 – 18psi; over 1800cc – 20psi.

CLASS C - 1990 onwards RWD Series Production Cars & Sports Cars

Rear wheel drive Series Production Cars & Sports Cars first registered on or after 1 January 1990.

Permitted modifications in accordance with Motorsport UK NCR 17.4.2.1 to 17.4.10.5.

Minimum tyre pressures - see also Class Definition (xii): Front-engined – 14 psi, Mid/Rear-engined – 20 psi

CLASS D - Series Production Cars not eligible for any other Class and Kit Cars:

Clarifications for Standard Cars and Road Cars

You must be able to produce proof of current UK Road Tax (and MOT where applicable) at the event if competing in one of the Standard or Road Car classes. Proof of Road Tax will be via DVLA Confirmation of Vehicle Tax or a recent copy of the DVLA enquiry website (www.vehicleenquiry.service.gov.uk). It is the driver's responsibility to prove compliance.

Whilst all Standard Cars and Road Cars must remain in a totally road legal condition at all times, car registration numbers may be obscured.

Standard Car Classes - Standard Cars conforming to Motorsport UK NCR 14.4.13

These classes are intended to provide low budget competition for newcomers to the sport or those with limited funds. Other than adding FIA/Motorsport UK approved/homologated safety equipment and/or fitting uprated brake friction material, no other modifications are allowed. Any replacement component fitted must be a *Standard Part or a Standard Pattern Part.

Restricted to: 2 wheel drive cars produced since 1st Jan 2000, minimum production 5000 per annum.

Engine; Maximum capacity 2000cc, forced induction equivalency is 1.7. Junior drivers must also comply with NCR 14.2.1.9 to 11.

Wheels and tyres; Standard wheels, and list 1A tyres only, complying with Motorsport UK NCR 14.13.4.

Standard mHEV's (as defined in NCR 7/11) with all electrical equipment operating at less than 60vDC or 30vAC may enter the Standard Car classes, subject to the 1.7 forced induction equivalency where applicable.

* "Standard" means a component that was listed in the car manufacturer's price list for that model of car.

Classes 1A to 1G and 2A to 2D - Road Cars conforming to Motorsport UK NCR 14.4.14)

Tyres; Tyres must comply with NCR 14.4.14.6.

Brakes; Brake callipers, discs, master cylinder, shoes & pads can be modified. Non-ferrous discs are only permitted in accordance with NCR 7.2.10. Modification of the brake pedal is permitted. The fitting of aftermarket

pedal assemblies is not permitted. Anti-Lock braking systems can be removed but cannot be added to a vehicle that does not have one as a manufacturer specified option.

Suspension; Must comply with NCR 14.4.14.7. Strut Braces across the top of the front suspension turrets are allowed but these must be removable and not welded in place.

Safety; Pyrotechnic safety devices such as airbags and seatbelt pre-tensioners may be disconnected or removed.

Cars competing in Road-Legal condition:

Whilst Scrutineers and Championship Officials reserve the right to check all road-legal competition vehicles' taxation status via the DVLA website to ensure compliance with championship regulations, the onus remains with the competitor to prove compliance when requested.

It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that all data held by the DVLA is accurate for the vehicle being entered into competition.

Clarifications, other Classes

Class 5B: Formula Ford 1600 Racing Cars manufactured before 1st January 1994.

Only full sets of the following tyres are to be used:

Cars manufactured before 31.12.1971 – Cooper/Avon Formula Ford Specification ACB9 or Dunlop Historic Formula Ford tyres.

Cars manufactured 1.1.1972 to 31.12.1993 – Cooper/Avon Formula Ford Specification ACB9 or ACB10 tyres.

Classes 6 & 7 : Classic Cars and Rally Cars

All cars must comply with NCR 14. Where there is conflict between regulations, those in NCR 14 will apply.

ENVIRONMENTAL

The use of non-reusable plastic tyre-wraps is prohibited.
