## SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

Standard cars, road rally cars and 2WD stage cars are all welcome. The events are held on gravel and shale/grass and are suitable for standard cars; sump guards are highly recommended. The test will be available to walk before the event. Test diagrams will be sent to all entered competitors by email and published on the Wern Ddu PCA Facebook group before the event.

The first car on track will be 9:00 AM. To maximise track time available for all competitors the target is up to 10 miles of competitive driving with course layout changes and up to 3 minutes each test.

Camping overnight is chargeable and must be pre-paid in advance, direct to the site owner. Please contact Andrew Crawley to arrange. Arrivals from 4:00 PM Saturday. Due to the location, car transporter trailers are welcome. Please park in the trailer park. Please arrive in time for scrutineering; late arrivals may not be able to access the paddock after the event has started.

This is a non-spectator event and venue however you are very welcome to come along and help marshal if you can. Onsite Catering is available from 8:00 am. Details are available on our social media pages.

**The Taster class** is designed as an introduction to new competitors and is open to anyone over 14 years old with no driving experience. Drivers without experience will be permitted to enter this class with experienced co-drivers only. Please contact <u>Andrew Crawley</u> for more details and the use of the club car. The Taster event costs £25 per person and includes family membership of Warrington & DMC and 3 timed runs of the main course.

All event regulations apply to class T. A Motorsport UK RS Clubmans licence is also required. This licence is free and can be obtained via this link: RS Clubman Licence - Motorsport UK. Places are strictly limited so please book early to avoid disappointment.

Warrington & District Motor Club has signed up to the StreetCar charter, designed to create easier routes into motorsports for young people. For the 23 March event, we will run a StreetCar Class. It will run on a short, dedicated track designed to be smooth enough to use your road car. Gail Millward-Jackson is the StreetCar Liaison Officer and organiser.

StreetCar is aimed at first-time drivers and participants will receive tuition, as required. Entries will be accepted on the day. Please allow for up to 45 minutes to arrange a free MSUK clubman's licence online. All event Supplementary Regulations apply to StreetCar.

Format for StreetCar competitors and co-drivers:

- Signing on from 10:00 am
- Course set up and walk
- 1:1 briefing
- StreetCar drivers and co-drivers are encouraged to marshal and sit in with experienced competitors on the main test.

The meetings will be held under the General Regulations of The Motor Sports Association Ltd (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions the promoting club may issue for the event.

### 1. ENTRY

The PCA entry fee is £50 per competitor. All entries must be made on the <u>official online entry form</u> and are considered provisional until fully paid. Entries for the February event open on publication of these SRs. Entries for all other events open the day after the previous event (or at least 6 weeks before the next event) and close 2 weeks before each event date.

The maximum entry for the meeting is 36 PCA + 2 Taster entries. The minimum entry is 24. The minimum entry for each class is 3. Should either of the minimum entries not be reached the organisers reserve the right to cancel the event or amalgamate classes as necessary.

The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry at their discretion. To qualify for a full refund of the entry fee, written notice must be received (H30 and H31) by the Entries Secretary no later than 2 weeks before the event date. Entries withdrawn later than this date may be entitled to a refund if it is possible to substitute your entry with a reserve. Please note that this will only be possible up to 2 weeks before the event.

In the event of cancellation due to COVID-19 regulations, all paid entries will be offered an entry for the next event date. If this date is not suitable a full refund will be offered.

### 2. ELIGIBILITY

The events are open to fully elected members of the promoting club, members of Bala MC, Wigan MC, Caernarfon & Anglesey MC and all registered ANWCC/SD34MSG Championship contenders. Entry is also open to up to an additional 10 Motorsport UK registered clubs and is allocated on a first-come-first-served basis.

All entries are provisional until fully paid and priority will be given in order of receipt of fully paid entries (D11.1). All drivers and passengers must be signed on using the official online entry form.

Each event will be a round of the ANWCC PCA Championship 2024, the ANWCC All-rounder Championship 2024 and the SD34 Challenge 2024. A Motorsport UK RS Clubmans licence is required (as a minimum) for all drivers and passengers. This licence is free. Please visit RS Clubman Licence - Motorsport UK for more information and details on how to apply.

Entries may be accepted from drivers of 14 and over at the date of the event, but they may only drive a touring/saloon car up to 2000cc and the passenger must hold a full RTA licence and be a person experienced in autotesting.

For saloon and cabriolet/sports cars with hood erected or hardtop fitted if the driver holds a valid non-provisional RTA licence, the passenger must be 12 years or over, be a club member, be at least 135cm in height and must have signed on (M16 and M21). See Motorsport UK General Rules regarding eligibility.

N.B. The PCA event is not recommended for a complete beginner without some driving experienceit is recommended for the first event a competitor should take part in the Taster event or street car event first.

All drivers are required to carry a signed-on passenger in all timed tests. The passenger must occupy the seat alongside the driver and wear a properly fastened and approved seat belt at all times during the test. No other passenger is allowed.

All drivers and passengers will be expected to marshal during the day and help clear the course and event equipment at the end of the event.

### 3. PROGRAMME

The meeting programme will be:

- Scrutineering will open at 7:30 am
- Registration opens at 7:30 any competitor not signed on by 08:45 may be disqualified.
- The first test starts at 09:00. The event is scheduled to finish at approx. 16:00.

### 4. CLASSES

Class A	Production Saloon and Sports Cars (hood up only) up to 1400 cc (with tax & MoT).			
Class B	Saloon Car (hood up only) 1401 to 2000 cc (with tax & MoT).			
Class C	ass C Production Saloon Cars (not driven to the event).			
Class D	ass D Production Sports Cars (with two seats only).			
Class E	All other cars including stage rally prepared cars, over 2000 cc and forced induction			

### 5. TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

- a. Production Saloon and Sports Cars in class A or B can be driven to the event and should be currently registered/MOT or entered into class C. A trailer may be used.
- b. All Class A and B cars must comply with the Road Traffic Act and the relevant Motorsport UK Technical Regulations and you may be asked to produce documentation at scrutineering.
- c. Stage rally-prepared cars need not be taxed, insured, MoT or driven to the event but must present a Motorsport UK passport.

- d. Four-wheel drive vehicles are not allowed.
- e. ALL Production Saloon and Sports Cars that are not taxed or MoT or insured will compete in Class C (Cars must still comply with major MoT items of condition and no removal of structural components of a standard car is allowed)
- f. ALL Cars must compete on road-legal tyres. Gravel tyres are acceptable.
- g. The maximum noise permitted from any competing vehicle is 96dB and will be checked during scrutineering.
- h. ALL convertible cars must have rear ROPS (rollover protection system).
- i. ALL cars fitted with ROPS must have suitable padding fitted to all accessible areas of the roll cage around the driver's and passenger's head
- j. Standard manufacturers seats and safety belts are permitted, but full harnesses are recommended and are mandatory if non-standard seats are used. All harnesses, seats and mounting points must meet MoT standards and conditions but do not need current Motorsport UK dates.
- k. For Classes C and E vehicles, interior carpets, rear seats and interior trims are not required. The dashboard must be standard and operational.
- I. ALL cars must have all windows fitted and operational windscreen wipers plastic side and rear windows are permitted.
- m. ALL cars must run tests with the side windows with a gap of no more than 4" (100mm).
- n. ALL cars must be presented in good condition and be structurally complete. For this event, the removal of structural components is not permitted.
- o. Turbocharged petrol cars are subject to a 1.7 multiplier. Diesel cars have no multiplier.
- p. In the case of deciding if a car is a prepared rally or fast road car, it will be deemed a rally car if it has any 3x of the following:
  - i. lightweight panels of non-standard production material
  - ii. structural changes and lightening
  - iii. plastic windows
  - iv. limited slip fitted (non-standard)
  - v. non-standard induction manifold
  - vi. extended wheel arches.
- q. No restrictions on tyres other than must not drop below the 3mm legal limit and be in good condition.
- r. Cars not MOT'd will be scrutineered to MOT standards except for lighting requirements and rear seat and rear belts.

### 6. AWARDS

### For each event:

- Fastest Time Overall (FTO) Trophy
- 1st in each class -Trophy
- Euan 18 Trophy fastest competitor under 18yrs
- Other awards are at the discretion of the Clerk of Course

## For the Warrington DMC 2024 PCA Series:

- The best scores from a maximum of 5 events count towards the 2024 PCA Championship.
- The overall Champion will be the competitor with the highest number of Championship points gained.
- Points will be calculated according to a Performance Index for each event class:

Performance Index = (Class Average/Competitors Time) x 10

The Class Average is calculated from the best 5 competitors in that class. If there are fewer than 5 competitors in a class then the fastest time will be added in the required number of times to make up the 5 best competitors times necessary to calculate the average.

- Awards will also be given to 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each class.
- The Euan U18 Award will be presented to the competitor with the highest number of Championship points gained who is under 18 on the date of the first event of the series.
- Other awards are at the discretion of the Clerk of Course.
- · Competitors may receive only one award.

### 7. MARKING AND PENALTIES.

Time taken to complete the course	Actual time taken
Starting before the 'Go' signal	5 seconds per offence
Striking a cone	5 seconds per offence
Failure to stop astride the stop lines	5 seconds
Taking an incorrect route on any course (Wrong Test) *	60 seconds
If your car fails to continue you may use another car	No championship points will be awarded

<sup>\*</sup>If a driver returns to the point of their mistake, and then completes the test correctly, a wrong test does not apply.

### 8. GENERAL:

- a. Cabriolets/Sports Cars will compete with the hood erected or a hardtop fitted.
- b. Refuelling MUST take place in the designated refuel area.
- c. All servicing MUST take place in an area covered by a ground sheet. Extreme care must be taken to prevent oil or fuel spills. Please report any spills to HQ for clean-up.
- d. Stop astride points may be included in the tests. Please check your diagrams. A 30-second penalty applies for not stopping.
- e. Test diagrams will be published before the event. Any changes on the day will be communicated to the drivers at the drivers briefing. All competitors will have an opportunity to walk each test layout before timed runs start for that course.
- f. The test layouts may vary from event to event, between long courses with a maximum of 2 cars on track or 2 shorter tests run simultaneously. In the case of tests running simultaneously, competitors will progress to the next test only when directed to do so by marshals.
- g. The target is for each driver to have 4 or more runs at each layout, however, the number of predicted runs will be announced at the drivers briefing; runs are dependent on weather conditions and delays on the day.
- h. Events 1,2,3,4,6,7 and 8-Competitors will get the opportunity of attempting 2x runs at 3 different courses. 1 run from each course will be required to be classed as a finisher.
- i. Event 5 The courses will be shorter and the number of courses will be confirmed in the Final Instructions.
- j. A Stop signal will be displayed if there is an obstruction on the course. A competitor must stop immediately on deployment of the signal and a re-run will be allowed. The Stop signal will be displayed at the drivers briefing
- k. In the event of a tie, the fastest run of the first course will determine the tie and then the fastest on the second course, etc until the tie is resolved.
- I. To be classified as a finisher, competitors must start at least one run at all courses or as per Motorsport UK General Regulations.
- m. The competitor will observe all instructions from the marshals and/or officials.
- n. You must start and finish the event in the same vehicle you started in to be eligible for points on the day and the championship.

### 9. PAPERWORK

It is the competitor's responsibility to print off and bring the appropriate paperwork to the event. No paperwork will be provided at the event.

Competitors will be identified by numbers clearly displayed as instructed. Numbers will be provided by the organisers.

#### 11. RESULTS

Provisional results will be available on the TimingAppLive throughout the event. At the end of the event, results will be declared provisional at which point any protest must be lodged correctly within 30 minutes (C5). Otherwise, the results will become final and the awards presented. Results will be sent out by e-mail as soon as possible after the event and published on the ANWCC website.

The use of mobile phones by competitors in the test area, whilst queuing before the start of a test or returning to the paddock area is prohibited. Any competitor found to be in breach of this regulation may be disqualified from the event.

## 14. RACE WITH RESPECT

All Competitors, their associates, Officials and Marshals must be aware of their behaviour and conduct at all times and any abusive language or harmful behaviour will not be tolerated. Any incidents must be reported to the Event Officials or Safeguarding Officer who will also relay the report to Motorsport UK. ### 15. INSURANCE EXCESS
